



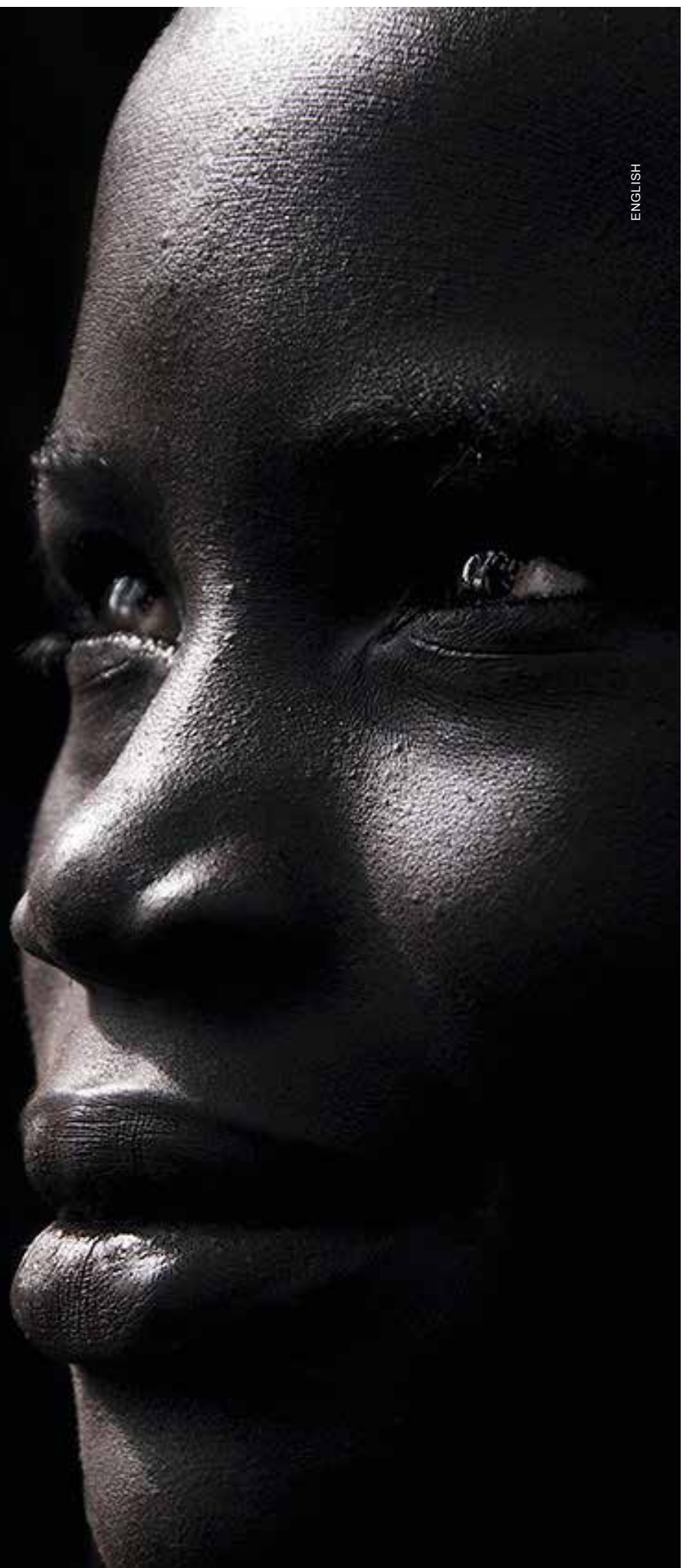

Introduction

The **Anesvad Foundation** has been engaged in charitable activities within the healthcare sector for over 50 years. In 2015 the Board of Trustees of the organization approved the creation of the **Solidarity and Co-operation Awards** aimed at rewarding the efforts of Spanish development co-operation institutions and organizations working within the healthcare sector in sub-Saharan Africa and with particular emphasis on Neglected Tropical Diseases. This initiative has gained significant momentum and has become a major event in the organization's calendar. The seven editions of the Anesvad Awards held so far have seen 34 institutions and organizations recognized for their commitment to defending and promoting the Right to Health of vulnerable populations on the said continent.

This year 2023 we are holding the eighth edition of the Anesvad Awards, seeking to continue the encouragement and recognition of the efforts made by other institutions and organizations to defend and promote the Right to Health of vulnerable populations in sub-Saharan Africa.

In order to be eligible for these awards, candidates must register under the pertinent category on our website, and those nominations that are selected by the Anesvad Foundation will go through to the next stage where they will be required to file (in electronic format) all necessary documents and paperwork for that particular award as indicated in the general conditions.

The categories will be the following:

- **Lifetime Achievement Award.**
- **Organization with the best track record in Development Co-operation.**
- **Best Educational project or initiative for Social Transformation.**

The Anesvad Awards are international awards and they have 30,000 euros prize-money for each category.

General conditions of the award process

Aim

The Anesvad Awards aim to recognize the efforts of persons and organizations working to defend and promote the Right to Health of vulnerable populations in Sub-Saharan Africa, with particular emphasis on Neglected Tropical Diseases.

Categories

Lifetime achievement award

To acknowledge someone's professional dedication to the cause of Solidarity and Co-operation in sub-Saharan Africa, in promoting and defending the Right to Health and/or in the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD).

Candidates (who must be natural persons) may nominate themselves or they may be nominated by third parties (natural or legal persons) with the consent of the candidate.

The following factors will be taken into account when selecting the winner:

- Commitment to the Right to Health in his/her professional activity, and to the benefits deriving from this Right for sub-Saharan societies.
- The significance of the achievements or projects carried out.
- The contribution made to awareness within the local context, and where pertinent, internationally.

Organization with the best track record in development co-operation award

To acknowledge the achievements of a body or organization that performs a major role in Development Co-operation, in promoting and defending the Right to Health, and/or in the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD) in sub-Saharan Africa.

Non-profit organizations and institutions are eligible for this award (NGDOs, foundations, associations, universities, autonomous NGDO co-ordinators, etc.).

Organizations must be legally registered and must have been in existence for at least five years.

The following factors will be taken into account when selecting the winning institution:

- The results effectively obtained.
- The significance of the achievements or projects carried out.
- Any synergies with other persons or institutions, especially with interventions carried out by Anesvad
- Organizations whose aims are in alignment with the public policies of the sub-Saharan countries in which they operate.
- Organizations that contribute to strengthening sub-Saharan public healthcare systems.
- The level of innovation in the tasks carried out by the organization.
- The multiplier effect, i.e. the ease with which the activities carried out by the organization can be rolled out in other similar situations.

Best educational project or initiative for social transformation award

This rewards a major project or initiative in Education for Social Transformation carried out by a body or organization that tackles – from a critical perspective – the social determinants of gender, environmental sustainability, interculturalism, and/or disability, with an effect on health in sub-Saharan Africa and/or on the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD).

Non-profit organizations and institutions are eligible for this award (NGDOs, foundations, associations, universities, educational centres, autonomous NGDO co-ordinators; etc.).

Organizations must be legally registered and must have been in existence for at least five years.

The following factors will be taken into account when selecting the winning institution:

- The results effectively obtained.
- The significance of the achievements or projects carried out.
- Any synergies with other persons or institutions.
- Projects that contribute to strengthening sub-Saharan public healthcare systems.
- The level of innovation in the tasks carried out by the organization.
- The multiplier effect, i.e. the ease with which the activities carried out by the organization can be rolled out in other similar situations.

Prize money

Each one of the three categories has a cash prize of €30,000.

In the **Lifetime Achievement Award** category, the said sum shall be donated to the organization or project proposed by the award-winner, which must be compatible with the aims pursued by Anesvad of promoting the Right to Health and/or the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases in sub-Saharan Africa.

In the **Development Co-operation** and **Education for Social Transformation** categories, the said sum shall be donated to a project run by the winning organization (proposed by the organization itself), which must once again be compatible with the aims pursued by Anesvad of promoting the Right to Health and/or the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases in sub-Saharan Africa.

In addition, at the ceremony each award-winner will be presented with a sculpture entitled 'Moringa'.

Nomination of candidates

These awards are international in scope and comprise a three-stage process.

Stage 1. Registration

Persons and institutions seeking nomination for these awards must register their candidature for the pertinent category on our website, filling out the corresponding form for which there is a link at www.anesvad.org. Registration may be carried out in Spanish, English, or French.

Nominations may be filed by the interested persons themselves or by other persons on their behalf, or by institutions. The registration period opens on 24 February 2023 and closes on 17 March 2023 inclusive (until 23:59 hours Spanish time, GMT+1).

At this stage, **the only requirement is to fill out the form** available on the Anesvad Foundation website, **and no documents or paperwork need to be attached**.

Only in the event that you are informed by Anesvad Foundation by e-mail that your candidature has been accepted will you need to continue with the rest of the process. You will then be required to supply all documents and paperwork requested of you in order for your candidature to be considered in Stage 2.

A maximum of 3 nominations per category will go through to Stage 2, which shall be those that have obtained the highest scores in accordance with the Anesvad assessment criteria¹.

Stage 2. Candidature

Once all nominations registered have been considered, Anesvad Foundation will select those persons, projects, and/or institutions who/which, on the basis of its own assessment criteria and in accordance with these general conditions, are to be the candidates for each award category. For this purpose, Anesvad Foundation will contact them by e-mail requesting them to supply the **documents and paperwork** indicated at section 2.3.

The deadline for candidates selected to go through to Stage 2 to supply the said documents and paperwork in electronic format expires on 31 March 2022 (at 23:59 hours Spanish time, GMT+1). Failure to supply the said documents and paperwork in full within the time allowed and in the format required by these general conditions will result in the candidature being rejected. Persons and organizations that have registered but have not been selected to go through to the next stage are excluded from the process and as such will not be required to file any additional materials.

Documents and paperwork to be supplied

According to each category, candidates will receive an e-mail requesting them to supply the documents and paperwork set forth below, which is essential for their candidature to proceed:

Lifetime Achievement Award dedicated to the promotion and defence of the Right to Health and/or the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases in sub-Saharan Africa.

- Candidate's curriculum vitae (maximum of 10 pages).
- A report on the tasks carried out in sub-Saharan Africa in relation to the professional activity performed.
- List and description of his/her support for charitable causes.
- Organization or project in sub-Saharan Africa to which the prize-money received would be donated.

Organization with the best track record in Development Co-operation Award for the promotion and defence of the Right to Health and/or the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD) in sub-Saharan Africa.

A detailed report on the tasks performed over the past 3 years and the significance of the achievements or projects carried out, setting out the following:

- Description of the uniqueness of the activities performed by the organization and their level of innovation.
- The results effectively obtained.
- Any synergies with other persons or institutions.
- The ease with which the activities carried out by the organization can be rolled out in other similar situations.
- Reference letter endorsing the candidature from two organizations or institutions, at least one of which must have its registered office in Spain.
- Where pertinent to the candidature, supporting documents containing significant information such as annual reports, activity reports, publications, other awards received.
- Project in sub-Saharan Africa to which the prize-money received would be donated.

Best Educational project or initiative for Social Transformation Award, tackling – from a critical perspective – the social determinants of gender, environmental sustainability, interculturalism, and/or disability that have an effect on health in sub-Saharan Africa and/or on the fight against Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTD).

A detailed report on the most significant and relevant aspects of the project performed, including the following:

- Results attained through the project.
- Level of innovation and originality of the project or initiative nominated.
- Synergies of the project with other persons or institutions.
- Ease with which the action or project can be rolled out in other similar situations.
- Reference letter endorsing the candidature from two organizations or institutions, at least one of which must have its registered office in Spain.
- Education for Social Transformation Project to which the prize-money received would be donated.

In addition to the documents and paperwork specific to each category, all candidatures must supply the following:

Photocopy of the ID Card or passport of the person nominated, or of the Tax ID Number of the legal entity nominated.

Any other information or clarification required by the Anesvad Foundation.

Resolution

The jury, which will be made up of prestigious personalities from within the field of Development Co-operation, Education for Social Transformation, the Right to Health, Sub-Saharan Africa, media outlets, and social agents, as well as the award decision, will be announced prior to 25 May 2022 on the **www.anesvad.org** website. All winners will be notified in writing so as to be able to count on their participation in publicising the awards through the appropriate media outlets. Written notice will also be sent to all of those initiatives that have missed out on an award in this edition.

Acceptance of the award entails having to sign a donation agreement.

Other requirements to be taken into account

1. Receipt of the prize money is subject to the applicable tax regulations in force in Spain.
2. The assessment of the nominations and candidatures, as well as the decision on the merits for making each award, will be carried out by a jury designated by the Anesvad Foundation. The jury will have the following powers:
 - To take such steps as it may consider appropriate in order to verify the information provided on the nominations received.
 - In extraordinary circumstances, the jury may extend the time allowed for the submission of documents and paperwork to formalize nominations, provided that this decision is taken before making any awards. This additional time shall be notified by way of the Anesvad Foundation website and its social media profiles.
 - To declare that it is not going to make an award in any particular category where the nominations and/or the candidatures received do not meet the minimum requirements established for each category in the general conditions.
 - To grant the Award *ex aequo* to more than one candidature, expressly stating the special reasons that have led the jury to this decision. In this case, the prize money shall be shared equally between the winning candidatures.
3. The decisions of the jury cannot be appealed. The decision in respect of each one of the awards shall be made public through the media outlets and on the Anesvad Foundation website.
4. The awards will be presented at a public ceremony, the details of which will be announced at the appropriate time.

In order to receive their award, the finalists will have to attend the awards ceremony in person (natural persons) or duly represented (organizations), and they will also have to:

- Supply graphic material (with reproduction rights) for the announcement of the award and design of the ceremony.
 - Carry out such pre-arranged media interviews as may be organized by the Anesvad Foundation.
5. Failure to comply with these requirements may constitute grounds for withdrawing the award, at the discretion of the Anesvad Foundation. The award will then pass to the next highest-scoring candidate as assessed by the Jury.

In order to comply with the requirements laid down by the Spanish Prevention of Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing Law (Art. 2 of Law 10/2010 of 18 April) and its Regulations (Royal Decree 304/2014), the following additional documents shall be required:

- Valid ID document / passport and Tax ID number of the person, organization, or the representative thereof (which must coincide with that of the person signing the donation certificate).
- The incorporation by-laws and public registration in the country in which the winning organizations have their registered office.

- Copy of the power of attorney of the representative of the winning organizations signing the donation certificate.
 - Certificate issued by the bank to the effect that the bank account into which the prize money is to be paid is held in the name of the winning person or organization.
6. By taking part in these awards, the participating persons and organizations are deemed to have accepted the rules contained in these general conditions.

Intellectual property, confidentiality, and data protection

The persons and organizations nominated warrant that they are the owners of all intellectual and industrial property over the projects presented, as well as over the information (including the images) contained in the documents supplied.

Acceptance of these general conditions entails assigning to the Anesvad Foundation the rights to the reproduction, distribution, transformation, translation, and public communication of the content of the said materials at the awards ceremony, as well as in promotional activities and events linked to the Awards (including but not limited to paper, audio, audio-visual, electronic, or inclusion on the websites and/or social media sponsored by the Anesvad Foundation, with no geographical or time limits), and without the said use generating any right to economic remuneration. The winning parties acknowledge that the Anesvad Foundation has the right, but not the duty, to disseminate the information supplied.

In accordance with the regulations in force governing personal data protection, you are hereby informed that any personal data supplied shall be processed for the following purposes: administering the candidature and the resolution; administering attendance at the awards ceremony; sending out information regarding the Anesvad Foundation that may be of interest in the relationship that has been established. By returning the online nomination form and the related information, whether by e-mail or by post, you consent to the data-processing described above.

Likewise you are hereby informed that you may exercise your rights as laid down in the regulations governing Data Protection at any time. Likewise you are hereby informed that you can send any queries that you may have in this regard to the following e-mail address: rgpd@anesvad.org.
